Theme Sikhism

Key Enquiry Question: Are Sikh stories important today?

Knowledge:

Level 1:

- remember a Sikh story and talk about it
- talk about why stories are important to me and to other people, (assessed in Lesson 1)

Level 2:

- retell a Sikh story and start to explain its meaning
- talk about how a Sikh story has meaning to me

Level 3:

- describe what a Sikh/non-Sikh might learn from a Sikh story and start to explain why stories can be important
- understand how what Sikhs learn from stories can influence how they behave

Level 4:

- recognise that stories can be an important way of expressing belief and meaning and can explain the relevance of a Sikh story
- explain how some stories can teach Sikhs about what is important in life and relate this to non-Sikhs

Level 5:

- tell you several Sikh stories and explain why some of these are relevant to Sikhs and non-Sikhs
- explain why Sikh stories could be considered important today
