Breakfast Club

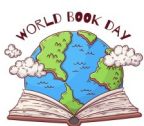

As well as a paid Breakfast Club offer which has been in operation for several years now under the supervision of Mrs. Nero, we are extremely proud to be one of only 2 primary schools in Reading offering a free Government funded Breakfast Club at 8:15am each morning. Something that certainly is popular amongst our families with 38% of the children in our school attending some days! World Book Day

On **Thursday 5th March**, we are celebrating World Book Day in school. Once again, the children are welcome to come to school dressed up as a children's book character for the day, or they can simply come wearing their "cosy reading" clothes or pyjamas. As always, on World Book Day, the children will be undertaking various book themed activities in their classes and as per previous years, we are running a competition in which children can bring in a potato that they have turned into a book character at home, which will then be judged. There will be tables out in the hall before school that day, for the children to put the potato characters on. We look forward to seeing their creations.



As part of World Book Day celebrations nationally, once again, the children will be coming receiving a £1 book token, which can be used at various outlets from 12th February to 15th March, to purchase a £1 World Book Day book or to use as money off of a book or audiobook costing £2.99 or more.
